## **Critical Worker Children: Pentecost Pictures**

Our critical worker children have been truly amazing over the last three months, cheerful and well behaved in what have been strange times. I hope you like some of their Pentecost pictures.

Thank you to all the staff who have been in school on rota and who have made the days interesting and fun for the children.

## Increases to the provision for the children of Critical Workers

As many more of our 'critical worker' parents have been required to return to work in the past couple of weeks, it has resulted in us having to review our provision across the whole school. We have followed the Government Guidance and prioritised school places for the children of critical workers.

We have re-organised all our classrooms, lunchtimes, playtimes and timetables to take into account the 2 metre social distancing rules. Unfortunately, this means our classrooms, which all vary in size, can only accommodate between 8 and 12 children at separated desks which adhere to the 2 metre limit.

This has meant that from Monday with Reception Class expanding we have <u>all fourteen</u> of our classrooms in use and <u>all staff</u> members (Teachers and TAs) allocated to run the class groups.

- Y6 four classrooms
- Y4/5 one classroom
- Y4 one classroom
- Y3 one classroom
- Y2 two classrooms
- Y1 two classrooms
- Reception three classrooms

Regrettably, this has also meant that we cannot offer places to all families that want one. We have established waiting lists, but will need to wait and see if the Government reduce the 2 metre distancing requirements before we can expand the provision further. We will of course keep in touch on this matter.

From Monday the teachers will all be back in school taking Class Groups. They will be maintaining our Home Learning provision (although there is no statutory obligation to provide this), so please continue as you have already been - considerate and patient as the Teachers get into their new day time routines – you may not get replies to emails and questions as quickly as previously.
