SWIMMING 2021-2022

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety: 2021-22 Following the lifting Covid Restrictions on swimming and pools, Years 3 to Year 6 are all had additional swimming in 2021-2022 as part of the Covid recovery plan. This will continue for 2022-23 with each year Group having 8-10 weeks of swimming.
