<u>Covid:</u> We coped extremely well last half term and only had an increasing number of cases (pupils and staff) in that final week. The staff and I would like to thank everyone for their vigilance in testing and keeping us informed – parents use of a common sense approach certainly helped keep us all as safe as possible. Communicating with School Reminder

Please remember that the best contact for the Head, Senior Leaders and Teachers is office@stfrancis.surrey.sch.uk.

As you can imagine we receive a huge number of messages, letters and emails into school each day. The school's Microsoft filtering system does mean that it can, on occasions, filter your correspondence into 'Other or Junk'. Whilst we do monitor these, communications can slip through the net. So we can deal with any communications from you as promptly as possible, please remember to follow the school protocol:

- Emails for the Head, Senior Leaders and Teachers and should be sent to
 office@stframcis.surey.sch.uk
 This email address is monitored throughout the school day and
 your query will be passed on to the relevant person.
- The individual Class emails: will only be checked on a weekly basis If a message is urgent please contact the office by email or phone.
- You can give non-urgent messages to your child's class teacher by putting a note in your child's
 planner, or speak to your child's teacher at the end of the day. Infant children Planners are
 looked at daily by school staff. Junior children need to make the Teacher or TA aware that there
 is a message in the planner and hand it to the staff member in class. If in doubt, email or phone
 the office.
- Urgent messages should always come in via the school office.

If you do not get an acknowledgement (within 3 days) that we have received your correspondence, please check with the office that we have received it. If replies are not received, then these can be checked via the office too.

• A member of the Senior Leadership Team, our ELSAs and TAs are almost always available on the school gates too for quick chats, though it is better to email or phone in with messages.

Extraordinarily for this year, due to the COVID situation and to best protect Fr Seán and Fr Stephen, they will not be meeting parents in person to sign the SIF forms.

The general process for applications remains the same. Before the closing date for applications:

- Parent/Carers complete their Local Authority Common Application Form online.
- Parent/Carers must also complete the <u>SIF</u> and return it to the school.
- The school will formally log receipt of each SIF form from each Catholic applicant.
- The school will then take all the Catholic applicants' SIFs to the priest in one go for the priests to complete the relevant section for each applicant and return to the school.

We're really pleased that our foodbank is now back to operating a full service. Since the Covid restrictions lifted in July we've been able to sit with clients and have a cup of tea or coffee and a chat. Most importantly we've been able to signpost them on to further services if required, as the foodbank is so much more than just giving food. We're continuing to see higher levels of foodbank use than before the pandemic, and 2021 looks like the level of need could be higher than in 2020. Increasing numbers for us is not an achievement! We're working with The Trussell Trust to bring change so that everyone has enough money for the essentials and doesn't need to rely on a charity to provide for them.

In June we opened our new Order and Collect Service at King's church in Oxted. Although Caterham Foodbank was set up by Caterham churches and so its name, we've always supported clients in the whole of Tandridge. As you're probably aware there are very poor public transport links south of Caterham so the new service at King's church provides a location closer to South Tandridge residents.

King's church have also recently opened Connect Oxted Debt Service, to help Tandridge clients struggling with debt. Some of the foodbank volunteers will soon complete their training to be Money Mentors for this service, to enable us to directly help people referred to the foodbank. This will be a great service to be able to offer our clients.
