Science Experiment

Gummy Bear

Before you put the bear in the water...

Hold your bear up to the window. How much light can get through? Put the bear between your fingers and press it. What happens?

How big is your bear?

What do you think will happen to the bear when it is left in water?

4 days later...

What has happened to the bear that was in the water?

Can you compare the bear that's been in the water with a new gummy bear? How are they different?

Gummy Bear

Science Experiment

You will need:

Water

Clear plastic cup

Gummy bears

Method

- 1. Choose a gummy bear.
- 2. Fill the cup 1/3 full with water.
- 3. Place the gummy bear in the water.
- 4. Leave for up to 4 days.
- 5. Compare with a gummy bear that has not been added to water.



Parents/ Carers:

News!

Much has changed for the foodbank since our last newsletter 6 months ago, and yet in other ways little has changed. It's now a year since this serious pandemic caused such massive disruption and we've seen huge changes to our everyday lives, and all by a virus we can't even see! Our foodbank service is still running a restricted service due to the pandemic. We continue to be able to help people with food but unable to have a cup of tea with them or signpost them to other services. We're looking forward to restrictions being lifted and like everyone else being able to meet people again. Lots of our amazing volunteers have now had their first vaccine dose which all helps towards the end of lockdown. Sadly in 2020 our foodbank service was needed more than ever before, and the number of people we helped increased by 125% from 2019.

In October we had just moved into our new warehouse premises, giving us much needed storage for all the generous donations we regularly receive. Straight after moving we took in many harvest donations from local schools and churches. Considering many of these weren't having their traditional celebrations due to Covid, we still received an incredible amount which really helped us in the months following. In November we started to prepare for distributing our foodbank Christmas hampers. Not surprisingly given the circumstances many people have found themselves in, we had a large number of hampers to prepare, 379 in December 2020, this was a 60% increase from 2019. Once more huge thanks to Caterham, Oxted and Godstone Lions for their financial contribution towards the hampers.

These were so gratefully received by many in our community.

In February we were really pleased to reopen a foodbank centre on the hill in Caterham. Since the start of the pandemic we had to close the centre at Centenary Hall, so we were operating from one centre in the valley from Caterham Baptist Church. We're now open on Mondays at Oakhall church and Thursdays at Caterham Baptist Church. Many thanks to Sacred Heart Church for the many years we operated the foodbank centre there at the Centenary Hall.

Thank you so much for your continued support of the foodbank. We continue to look forward to a day when our service is no longer needed because everyone has enough for the basics, but until that time comes, with your support we'll do all we can to help those in crisis.
