Dear Parents and Carers

Re-Opening of Schools

We are all disappointed, though not surprised, that we are not able to be back fully after half term. The remote learning will continue for those at home and in-school provision will be for vulnerable children and children of critical workers. We shall all be watching the TV in half term for further updates!

Lockdown Rules: We know the vast majority of our lovely community are sticking to the Government Guidelines for the lockdown and we thank you for your efforts. Children are always eager to tell their friends and us about their lives and the exciting things they are doing. This week we have been over-hearing and hearing directly of events where it appears that some families may not be adhering to the lockdown rules. The families at home and especially staff in school who are taking risks to support vulnerable and critical worker children should not be put at any additional risk by the actions of a small minority. We are all desperate to be out of this situation as soon as possible, but it will only happen if we all abide by the rules.

Infant Playground Works

Our planned infant playground works (drainage improvements, Apple and Y1 fenced play areas and resurfacing) have been brought forward from Easter to next week. If the work is done now it means when we are all back together, we will have a lovely new area for the infant children to play in. There will be less puddles, a new Apple and Y1 fenced play area - and smooth playground surface! We feel it will be worthwhile putting up with some inconvenience in school for the next 9 days, for a positive payoff for when we are all back again.

Trim Trail and Gym Area

 Our new trim trail and gym are is almost finished and we shall be able to use it very soon!

Story-telling and Poetry Area

Our story-telling chair and benches are now in place. This area is very special to us as the chair has been
purchased from donations in memory of Ms Charlotte Eade, one of our parents, who passed away
suddenly a year ago, she loved reading and was a regular volunteer in school.

The area will enhance the reading opportunities in school and make a fabulous addition for our children to read and recite poetry in. Our thanks also go to Mrs Shannon whose enthusiasm for poetry has helped fund the benches and we are looking forward to seeing poetry club using it to the full when we are all back.

Lateral Flow Testing in School (for Staff only)

Covid Lateral Flow 'quick' testing for staff in schools begins this week. In primary no children are tested - it is for staff only and not children. If staff members test positive they will have to go for a full 'PCR' covid test to have it confirmed. In light of this, we are anticipating potential disruption to the Critical Worker Bubbles. If a staff member tests positive, we will have to follow the covid test and trace guidelines and may need to close bubbles. If this happens and we cannot open a bubble safely, the office will contact critical worker families as soon as we can, so please be aware and watch out for an email or message.
