Y4 Parents - please note - Y4 Multiplication Tables Check

Year 4 will be taking the statutory multiplication tables check (MTC) in June this year. The purpose of the check is to determine whether pupils can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify pupils who may need additional support. The Y4 teachers are helping the children in school. All classes have access to and should be using Timestables Rockstars and Purple Mash, both of which have a timestables section. Year 4 are encouraged to do extra on these as the test will be an online one and this will help them in preparation for the test.

St Francis' School has been invited to take part in Surrey's

Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health Transformation Programme

Together with five other local schools, St Francis' is working with Surrey to develop a model of support which, if successful, can be replicated Nationally across schools.

One example of working differently, the schools involved in the programme are trailing, is having a primary Mental Health Worker based in each school every week; this has proved to be extremely valuable to both adults and children in all of the schools.

This Half Term we are introducing Wellbeing Ambassadors for Children and Staff. Children in Year 5 have been invited to volunteer for the role and their class have held a vote to select the candidate. The successful candidates will be trained this week. Their role will be to work with Key Staff to promote wellbeing across the school through activities and events. They will not offer 1-2-1 sessions with children. We will be providing our staff with similar support.

Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever. cough & difficulty breathing
- · the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- · you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- . the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas

How can you stop coronaviruses spreading?

If you need to cough or sneeze



Catch it with a tissue



Bin it



Kill it by washing soap & water or

You should wash hands with soap & water or hand sanitiser



After breaks & sport



Before cooking



On arrival at any childcare or educational setting



After using the toilet





Try not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands



Do not share items that come into contact with your mouth such as cups & bottles



If unwell do not share items such as bedding, dishes, pencils & towels

What should you do if you feel unwell?

Keep away from others and stay at home to stop the infection spreading. Avoid public transport if you think you have symptoms of coronavirus. If you become unwell at a place of education, tell a member of staff and let them know if you have travelled to any other countries in the last 14 days.

If your staff member or parent thinks you have symptoms of coronavirus, they should call NHS 111 for advice. Follow the UK Government advice for childcare or educational settings gov.uk/government/publications/guidance-to-educational-settings-about-covid-19. Parents can visit NHS.UK to find out more information. Teachers and support staff should follow the UK Government advice.
