Foodbank and Crisis Support

As the lockdown continues we know that some families may be experiencing difficulties. Do please contact me via the office email office@stfrancis.surrey.sch.uk if you experience difficulties during the coming weeks. Any matters discussed will be treated with confidentiality. I have access to those that can support families via the local Foodbank, the Church SVP and Diocese Crisis Fund. Do not hesitate to ask – there is no need for any of our families to be in need, especially for food.

Re-Opening of Schools

I am sure that you are all seeing the constant press speculation at present about the reopening plans for schools. We know that you must be as fed up with all the speculation and waiting as we are! There is nothing we all want more than to be back, but it must be when it is safe to do so. Headteachers were asked to respond to a survey on Friday 1st May from the National Association of Headteachers (NAHT) on the variety of ways that this could be achieved, and issues around re-opening safely. Today Heads also took part in an NAHT Q&A session online about our concerns over re-opening. I am afraid that we are all still non-the wiser on what will be announced on Sunday! The teaching unions are, however, very much working with the Government to ensure that we only open when it has been planned and safe for both children and staff. I am sure we will all be watching Sunday's briefing with interest!

Please be assured, that will manage whatever the transition may be when we know. It will all be dependent on advice from the Government, the DfE, Unions and Surrey Local Authority Education Department.

The staff and I are already planning a 'recovery curriculum' that includes time for readjustment, time to talk and explore well-being, as well as time to regain routines and begin to pick up learning with the children. We are used to dealing with children of all abilities, children returning after a long summer holiday, children starting the school mid-way through years, missing learning through hospital stays, starting school with English as an additional

language etc. We will share further information on any transition plans as soon as we can after Sunday's announcement.


Father Seán has also been uploading, under 'Featured Videos', a History of the Church Course, which Parents may wish to view and listen to.
