Parking, Parental Behaviour and Local Residents

Parking and driving behaviours have been particularly bad this week and I have had to spend time dealing with various complaints and notifications about dangerous driving and parking. As usual it is by a minority of parents, but sadly the impact is on us all. Please be mindful of he following:

- 1. More care needs to be taken by drivers when entering and exiting the cul-de-sac, particularly where the zebra crossing is. Our parents are using the Sunnydown side as part of the Covid distancing needs and some drivers are not taking care at or near the Zebra crossing and junction.
- Parking bays are for one car only. The two drivers (from St Francis') who parked up over the kerb and one behind the other in the diagonal bays this week, and then had to back out, was dangerous. It also affected the person using the diabbled by as it restricted vision for them backing out.
- 3. Be mindful that we do have pupils and parents cycling and scooting to school.
- 4. We understand that everyone is tired as the end of term approaches and tempers can get frayed, but aggressive behaviour and the use of offensive language is not acceptable, especially in front of the children.

Additionally, the Headteacher's of all three schools have also received requests recently from residents in local roads (eg Portley and Cedar Park Road) asking us to remind our parents to park legally and show considerate behaviour towards the residents. A number of them are elderly, vulnerable and wheelchair bound and there has been some less than thoughtful behaviour experienced by some of them lately, as well dangerous and illegal parking. Local residents in neighbouring roads are usually very accommodating and it is unusual to have complaints from them, so please adhere to the highway code.

Please do be careful and patient when driving in and out of school and on local roads, we do not want any child or adult to be involved in an accident. If there is an accident (on or off site) and drivers break the law they will be dealt with through legal channels by the Police.

At St Francis' we pride ourselves on our school values, please can we all remember to show consideration to each other and the local residents and their roads.

We still actively encourage you all when possible to walk or scoot to school, or to park down by the Salmon's Lane green and walk in.

I am sorry to end with a parking grumble and I do know it is a minority of people, but we worry about the safety of the children, parents and carers. We all have enough going on with Covid, without having to worry about parking, accidents and disrespectful behaviour too.

On a brighter note - Elizabeth Court Care Home Decorations Request: Well done to the children Treetops for lovely decorations and in classes for Smile Notes - 'things that make us smile'. They were delivered to the Care Home yesterday and will be enjoyed by the residents. We hope we have helped make them smile!


2021-22 Catholic applications – for Reception places for St Francis' Catholic Primary School

For those needing a **<u>Reception place in 2021-22</u>**, there is a <u>Virtual Tour of the School</u> on the Admissions page of the website. Please do remember to read and follow the Admissions instructions below If you need any help or advice on Admissions, do contact the school Office

Extraordinarily for this year, due to the COVID situation and to best protect Fr Seán and Fr Stephen, they will not be meeting parents in person to sign the SIF forms.

The general process for applications remains the same. Before the closing date for applications:

- Parent/Carers complete their Local Authority Common Application Form online.
- Parent/Carers must also complete the <u>SIF</u> and return it to the school minus the section usually completed by the priest.
- The school will formally log receipt of each SIF form from each Catholic applicant.
- The school will then take all the Catholic applicants' SIFs to the priest in one go for the priests to complete the relevant section for each applicant and return to the school.
