Dear Parents, Grandparents and Carers,

Hoping you have all had a good half term, and I am sure your children are looking forward to a much needed break.

Some of you may be aware, I took over the reigns of drop-off co-ordinator this year. The drop-off system is run by parents who volunteer to give 15 minutes of their time to help others get their children to school on time so they can get on with their day ahead. The current rota requires three parents to operate each day so traffic is kept to a minimum and children can get to school safely. This means we need a minimum of thirty parents to volunteer for a fortnightly rota. Historically parents were opening car doors every three weeks due to many people kindly volunteering. Unfortunately, numbers have reduced considerably since then, which has then required parents to give up their time every fortnight.

I sent out a poster at the beginning of term to be circulated amongst class reps to appeal for helpers. Unfortunately, this did not yield any volunteers, and in that time, volunteers have continued to dwindle due to work commitments or personal reasons.

Currently, due to low numbers, I am now having to reduce drop-off helpers from three to two each morning from half-term, as I do not think it is fair that parents are asked to open car doors weekly, when for many this is their only day-off in the week. Going down to two helpers will unfortunately increase traffic on-site and on Whyteleafe road, and the time taken to drop your child off will increase. Due to increased traffic, I will appeal for some parents to park off-site and walk in to school with your children to reduce the flow of traffic.

So, what is involved in volunteering for drop-off?

- Opening car doors for parents from 0845-0900 to ensure their children walk through the school gates safely
- Choosing ONE day in the week to help, and this can be every 2, 3 or even 4 weeks!

Some may be thinking, 'well I don't use drop-off so why should I volunteer?' You do not have to! I personally do not use drop off and I co-ordinate it. Ultimately, it is 15 minutes of your time to help others have a smoother morning routine.
