Almost 50 St Francis Children and St Francis Alumini participated in the recent Reigate and Redhill Festival with some 120 entries between them

Commencing with, the speech and drama festival and exa- body building blocks of Solo and Shared (Acted/Unacted) Poetry and Prose in KS1 and building up to Bible Reading, Solo and Duologue Acting, Shakespeare and TV Newsreader the pupils achieved a record number of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3rd place Honours, plus Cups and some 18 Medals between them notwithstanding the Merit Star, Merits and performer certificate for those who overcame their nerves to get up on stage and recite solo to a sea of strange faces for the very first time

The children benefitted from the wonderful constructive comments from film and TV Actor, combat instructor, dancer, examiner, adjudicator, and dad, Jean Marc Perret who commenced his performing journey in Festivals age 6 landing a role age 14 in Prince Caspian on TV and later trained at the Bristol Old Vic.

Mr Perret emphasised the importance of festivals and poetry reciting for laying the foundations not only for acting but also for public speaking and life in general, Also to overcome fears as well as to learn to stand up to scrutiny at whatever age and develop resilience..

As Mr Perret noted, all the children are WINNERS through taking part. The children will be presented with their Festival an Poetry by Heart certificates, cups, medals, badges, etc at a forthcoming Celebration Assembly. Well done to each and every one and not least those who earned not just one medal /cup but two or three who have continued participating in the Festival building up their skills year on year..
