Sports Day Arrangements Wednesday 28th June

The weather forecast is currently looking good, so children need to be prepared for a hot day outside. Please make sure they have the following:

9:30: KS1 will be starting at 9:30 and ending their activities at 10:30. They will return to classes to do sports linked activities.

9:30: KS2 will be starting at 9:30 and finishing for lunch at 12pm.

12:00 Lunchtime: Children will all eat together on the field. .

1:30- 2.45 pm for the House Races/Relays on the field.

3.15pm Children will be taken back to classes to collect bags etc and be released out in the normal way. Please can parents keep back while the Staff take the children in so we can manage this quickly.

Parents & Lunchtime: At 12:00 parents can either leave the site for lunch and return at 1:20 for the afternoon races, or remain onsite but go to the designated parents' lunch area.




