
Choir - Summer Concert

Sports Day Arrangements

On Friday 8th July we will be holding our annual Sports Day.

All parents are welcome for the whole day, or as much of the day as you can attend, but please keep within the specified areas. This is to ensure that all children are safe and can easily get to their activities on time. We are trying a slightly different format this year to help us manage the events, staffing and hot weather, so please bear with us on the day.

The weather forecast is currently looking good, so children need to be prepared for a hot day outside. Please make sure they have the following:

- Sun cream applied before school.
- PE kit, including their house colour top if they have one.
- Sun hat.
- Drink bottle with water.
- School dinner children will have their lunch provided by the kitchen. Those on packed lunch should bring theirs in as normal.

Arrangements

8:45 Drop Off: As in previous years (pre-covid!), drop-off on Sports Day will be compulsory for all year groups, including Reception children. The children will be met at the main playground gate and taken into class. Parents are asked to wait outside while we register the children and get set up.

9:15: KS1 will be starting at 9:15 and ending their activities at 10:30. They will return to classes to do sports linked activities.

9:15: KS2 will be starting at 9:15 and finishing for lunch at 12pm.

12:00 Lunchtime: Children will all eat together on the field.

1:30pm for the House Races/Relays on the field.

3:15 Children will be taken back to classes to collect bags etc and be released out in the normal way. Please can parents keep back while the Staff take the children in so we can manage this quickly.

3:30-5:30: The PTA Summer Fun Event will commence after we have dismissed the children from classes. There will be the grand draw at 5pm and refreshments

Parents & Lunchtime: At 12:00 parents can either leave the site for lunch and return at 1:30, or remain onsite but go to the infant playground. Unfortunately, to manage safeguarding on the day, parents will not be able to sit with the children for lunch. The PTA will be selling cold drinks and snacks for parents throughout the day.

Etiquette for Sports Day:

- Teachers/helpers decisions are final.
- Remain outside the activity and running areas within the designated spectator's area.
- Positive attitudes to all children no negative comments if any child is beaten in a race and applaud the efforts of all children

Walking Instructors needed

Do you want to become a paid Walking Instructor?

Our school is assisting Surrey County Council's Safer Travel Team to help them recruit for Walking Instructors, as part of their new Walking Training programme for primary schools.

What is the Walking Training programme?

The Walking Training Programme is a road safety and active travel skills awareness course that will be aimed at children ages 7 to 8 years old (Year 3). It will provide pupils with road safety skills to better enable them to safely walk to and from school with their parents and carers and prepare them for independent travel. Further information about the Walking Training course can be found here.

What is a Walking Instructor?

A Walking Instructor will be able to lead a small group of Year 3 pupils in the playground and on the road, outside the school gates, to provide them with necessary road safety skills and knowledge. Delivering an informative, robust and entertaining programme of learning that highlights the necessary road safety skills, providing Year 3 pupils with the foundation to feel safe and comfortable as a <u>pedestrian navigating Surrey's roads</u>.

There are many benefits to becoming a Walking Instructor, including: being at the forefront of a new active and sustainable travel programme in Surrey; working with pupils to encourage walking to school and providing them with the necessary road safety skills. We will also provide you with a competitive salary, flexible working that can be based in and around the school day as well as full training, including safeguarding and First Aid.

Who would be an ideal Walking Instructor?

- Someone that has experience working with primary aged children, in either a professional or personal manner
- Interested in encouraging primary school-age pupils to feel more confident traveling actively and sustainably to school.
- Interested in road safety and or active travel.
- Confident engaging children of 7-8 years old both in the classroom and during the on-road training elements of the course.
- Confident working on your own, as some courses may not have another Instructor attending with you.
- Looking for a flexible, term time position.
