# **Prom Praise**

On Tuesday 12th May 54 choir children attended Prom Praise for Schools at the Royal Albert Hall. A wonderful event and fantastic musical experience for all our children. The chosen theme was David's story, from shepherd boy to his crowning as King. The aim of the project was to explore the Bible story through the visual and performing arts. We were accompanied by the live All Souls Orchestra, treating us to a delight and range

of music. Well done to everyone and thank you to Mrs Hardy and all staff and Parents who helped. It was a long but very special day!







# **Big Walk and Wheel Week**

Next week we are taking part in the national Big Walk and Wheel Week. This is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world. In 2023, 3,096kg of nitrogen oxide avoided as a result of the 10-day challenge\* In 2023, 1,890 tonnes of CO2 avoided as a result of the 10-day



challenge\* In 2023, pupils at 1,862 schools made 2,666,937 journeys to school by foot, wheelchair, scooter and cycle \*Based on the assumption the journeys logged in the challenge would otherwise have been made by car. Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's daily routine. It helps them arrive to school more relaxed and alert, and is great for their mental wellbeing too. We will be counting the numbers of children Walking, Scooting and Cycling each day next week. Children will get a badge on the gate (or in class if it rains!) for each day they do this.

# **Bags of Hope**

Your support for the Green Redeem scheme was quite overwhelming – thank you so much. We are hoping to get the same energy for our Green Redeem project - Bags of Hope. We are delighted once again to be teaming up with the Amara Charitable trust and the Rotary to take part in the 'Bags of Hope' scheme. We will be collecting 2<sup>nd</sup> hand school bags, drawstring bags, satchels and ruck sacks which must be in good condition and at least A4 size. The bags will be sent to children in need in Nairobi and other developing countries around the world. Not only is this a wonderful way to help less fortunate children but its also a great way to reduces waste! We will accept donations between Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March and Thursday 28th<sup>th</sup> March. Please do not bring bags in before 18<sup>th</sup> March! We plan to do one more collection at the end of the summer term of this academic year so please don't throw out any suitable bags. # **Oscar Romero Day**

On March 24th it is Oscar Romero's Feast Day (this is a Sunday) we as a school will mark this day on **Monday 25**<sup>th</sup> **March**. Where we invite the children to wear colourful clothing to school - this could be your child's house coloured T-shirt, or other colourful and bright clothes - like the El Salvador Crosses. We remember Oscar Romero because, despite the difficulties he faced in his country, he spoke out about social injustice, violence and discrimination. The children throughout the year have been learning about different areas of CST (Catholic Social Teaching) and Oscar Romero is an example of a man who lived out those values. At St Francis we have Oscar Romero El Salvador designed crosses in every classroom. We thank you for your support.
